

Article VII, Section 8, Paragraph H:

“All swimming pools, as herein defined, shall be enclosed by a barrier with a minimum height of 4 feet, with all gates provided being self-closing and all vertical or horizontal openings being no more than 4 inches, which would deter and/or prevent the accidental or unauthorized use of said swimming pool. Fences which enclose the rear yard of the property and meet the above requirements shall be an approvable barrier if they totally secure the area around the swimming pool structure.”

Acceptable Fences:



For many temporary pools, this is an easy and cost-effective fence. They are often made out of vinyl and can be purchased online for less than \$100. They are easy to install and deter people from using or falling into your pool.



For more permanent pools (especially in-ground pools and or year-round above ground pools), a permanent fence may be the best option. A four foot high fence **with a self latching gate** is required. Many of these fences range in price depending on the material. Vinyl and plastic are often the cheapest options while wood and wrought iron fences tend to be a little more expensive.
