Protect Your Home this Winter

The City of Archdale is responsible for maintaining main water lines and service lines to the meter. Water lines and pipes beyond the meter are the responsibility of the customer.

Preventing Frozen Pipes:

- Drain swimming pool supply lines, as well as lawn and landscape sprinkler systems at the end of summer. (Do not put automotive antifreeze in drained water lines.)
- Remove, drain, and store outdoor hoses. If the outside faucets have shut-off valves, close them, and drain outside faucets. If no shut-off is available or if frost-free faucets have not been installed, cover the faucets with insulation of Styrofoam covers.
- Survey property for water supply lines that may be unprotected, such as unheated basements, attic areas, crawlspaces, garages, under cabinets, on exterior walls, at the water meter, or at the point where main supply lines cross the foundation into the hose. Insulate both hot and cold water lines in these areas (Hot water lines freeze as readily as cold water lines if water is not flowing through them.)
- Protect exposed pipes by wrapping them with foam pipe sleeves (taping at all junctions), covering with fiberglass insulation, or installing UL-listed heat tape or heat cable. Even several layers of newspaper will do in a pinch when temperatures are expected to remain cold for shorter periods.
- Meter lids should remain on the water meter box at all times.



Loose Leaf Collection

Loose leaf collection is underway. Pickups end on January 31st. Make sure loose leaves are placed near but not in the roadway and away from storm drains.



Fats, Oil, & Grease

What do bacon, ice cream, and peanut butter all have in common? They are more than just tasty treats. They are also sources of fats, oil, and grease (FOG). While fats, oil, and grease add extra flavor to our food, pouring FOG down the drain can create clogs in the sewer collection system. These blockages can back up sewage into your street, yard, or home! Think of it this way - If it can clog arteries in your body, then it can also clog sewer pipes.

Fortunately, clearing up FOG is as easy as doing a few simple things around the kitchen. Pour cold fats, oil, and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage. Never pour fats, oil, or grease down sink drains or toilets. And, use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes. Together we can avoid sewer overflows.
